A fourth frame, added by Pastor Jon Tyson:

o Gender dysphoria is part of our sin nature which fails to display the glory of God fully.

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Two key questions that must be asked of believers struggling with gender dysphoria:

- Lordship–What claim does Jesus make on my body?
- Formation-How does this response to GD impact my discipleship?

Three areas of response:

1. Cultural

Philip Rieff cultural framework:

- First World: Pagan worlds that are grounded in sacred order and sacred myth.
- Second World: No longer characterized by fate but faith. Singular and transcendent.
- Third World: Anticulture with no sacred order. God becomes an unnecessary hypothesis.

Genesis 1:26-28

Culture (biblically): Ordering chaos

Modern world (anticulture): Disordering to create chaos

Agents of redemption: Called to create order in the midst of chaos

"Christians today are not opponents of the anticulture. Too often we are a symptom of it. In short, our response to the major issues of our day–particularly those associated with the LGBTQ+ movement and its demands–cannot be isolated from the wider framework of anticulture in which we live. We cannot blithely accept no-fault divorce, for example, and then complain that *Obergefell* redefined marriage. The basic redefinition of marriage did not take place in 2015 but when Governor Ronald Reagan signed no-fault divorce into law in California in 1970."
