Praying the Daily Office

Introduction: The Daily Office, also called "Fixed Hours of Prayer," is an ancient discipline intended to accomplish two primary goals: 1) to offer praise to God throughout the day in recognition of His worth, and 2) to daily keep us connected to the presence and power of God. We, at York Alliance, used this tool throughout the 2020 year. We were encouraged to pray three daily offices–Morning, Midday and Evening. The specific times of these offices will vary from person to person but, ideally, should remain consistent from day to day.

WEEK 1 - MORNING OFFICE

Silence and Centering

Canticle (Song of Praise) for the week: Psalm 100

Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands; serve the Lord with gladness and come before His presence with a song. *

Know this: The Lord Himself is God; He Himself has made us, and we are His; we are His people and the sheep of His pasture. *

Enter His gates with thanksgiving; go into His courts with praise; give thanks to Him and call upon His name. *

For the Lord is good; His mercy is everlasting; and His faithfulness endures from age to age. *

* Here and in subsequent designations, take time to pause and meditate.

Morning Prayer

O God, the King eternal, whose light divides the day from the night and turns the shadow of death into the morning: Drive far from us all wrong desires, incline our hearts to keep Your law, and guide our feet into the way of peace; that, having done Your will with cheerfulness during the day, we may, when night comes, rejoice to give You thanks; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Morning Psalm for the week: Psalm 99

Scripture Readings

Each daily Scripture passage should be read several times slowly. Take time to meditate on the depth of the words and ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate His truth.

Sunday: Ephesians 1:3-14 / Monday: James 1:2-8 / Tuesday: Isaiah 9:1-7 Wednesday: Matthew 16:1-4 / Thursday: Acts 2:22-24 / Friday: 1 Kings 3:1-9 / Saturday: Hebrews 5:11-14

Lord's Prayer (Pray slowly, phrase by phrase)

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your Name,

Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven

Give us today our daily bread

Forgive us our sins

As we forgive those who sin against us.

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are Yours. Amen.
